



2005 CUI Brownie Awards Winners

Toronto, October 13, 2005 — The Canadian Urban Institute today announced the names of winners in the 2005 CUI Brownie Awards competition. The Brownie for the **best overall project** was awarded to **Dockside Green**, a project located in the City of Victoria, BC. The **best large-scale project** award went to **King Liberty project**, a 45 acre redevelopment of former industrial site in Toronto, Ontario. The **best small/medium scale project** award was given to **The Kaufman Lofts**, the adaptive re-use of a former factory in Kitchener, Ontario.

The CUI Brownie Awards, sponsored by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC), are given to projects and programs that reflect leadership and innovation in brownfield redevelopment, a key building block in community revitalization. For the first time this year, the awards committee, representing ten professional and industry organizations, selected finalists in each of the six categories. The coveted CUI Brownie Awards were announced at the CBN “*Brownfields 2005: Developing Livable Communities*” conference in Ottawa on October 13 by CUI president and CEO, Hon. David Crombie, CMHC Chairman, Dino Chiesa, and We Communications President, Todd Latham.

Noting that over 60 projects were nominated from both large cities and smaller communities in six provinces, Glenn Miller, CUI Vice President said “We were thrilled with both the quantity and quality of the nominations for this year’s awards,” said Miller. “I believe that the CUI Brownie Awards truly reflect the high level of innovation expertise in brownfields redevelopment across the country.
